2023 Grants Awarded

We were awarded two grants this year. One was the State Aid for Library Construction, which we will use to build a wheelchair accessible walkway from the front parking lot to the back parking area. The second was the SCR grant from Adirondack Lakes Center for the Arts. This grant allowed us to bring in local speakers, authors, and presenters to offer summer programming on Adirondack themed material for our community.
