

## Monthly Report June 2025

The Collection Committee met via email to review purchases for the month. 40 items were ordered, and all items ordered have been received, and processed. The Collection Committee has received the collection list for July, and it will be approved via email.


The Friends of the Library had a meeting on June 25, which I attended, along withNancy Seifts. The Friends announced they made \$1,606 from their June book sale. Other topics of discussion included preparations for the Tricky Tray, summer programming, and the remaining funds the Friends have committed to us.. I submitted financial request on June 3 for items for our Friday Foodie fun summer programs, but it was felt it didn't need to be approved as the \$300 check for Bold Yoga hasn't been used, as that service ended up being free for us. To date, we've received \$2,337.96 from the Friends, and there is \$3,663.04 remaining of their commitment.

The Friends also discussed running the bocce ball court at the Pavilion during the Village Centennial Field Day on Aug 16, from 11a-3p. I created a book gift basket for the Friends to use for their Tricky Tray. The next Friends meeting will be Sept 10 at 1pm.

## **Director's Report**

During the month of June:

- We had total of 660 patrons visit the library.
  - 529 adult patrons
  - 120 children patrons
  - 26 teen patrons
  - 27 Computers were used
- 950 items were checked out
  - Adult fiction books were circulated 261 times
  - Adult video circulated 77 times
  - Children's fiction circulated 419 times (this is a huge jump from last month)
  - eContent circulated 131 times
- We registered 10 new patrons
- 161 items were received to fill holds between MVLS & SALS
- 231 items were transferred to fill holds between MVLS & SALS
- 166 holds were placed
- 448 people used the wifi, for an average of 41 people per day

## **Other Updates**

June saw the library gearing up for a busy summer; we held some final programs for our year-round offerings, like PreK story time, Cr'After School, and Senior Musical Bingo. These programs will return in the fall, but will be replaced over the summer by other offerings. Patrons have already expressed interest in our summer programs, and we have a few kids signed up for our Summer Reading Program. Information is listed on our website and social media, as well as in printed form on flyers at the library, and around town. We have a few ads that have been listed with the Hamilton County Express, and that will continue for a few more weeks. Staff and volunteers are prepared and ready for our hour changes, which will go into effect on July 1.

The children's area has been decorated to tie in with the summer reading program theme of 'Color Our World'. The weekly Summer Reading Program for ages 4-9, and 10-16 will begin on July 15, and run for six weeks. Nearly all materials for crafts and activities have been purchased, and are organized and ready to go. Participants in the Summer Reading Program will be given reading trackers; they can turn these in each week in exchange for prizes. We will also have our Summer Reading Bingo pages available for patrons, beginning on July 1. The Bingo cards can be done by readers of all ages. The prize for participants who get a bingo is a small ice cream cone at Speculator Creamery.

Perhaps one of the most noteworthy events the library held in June was a meet and greet with SALS Director, Sara Dallas. This also served as a community Q&A session, and opportunity for Sara to let the public know about the IMLS cuts, and how these affect our library, and other rural libraries. We had a good turnout, with a few of our board members, and community members attending. Indian Lake library also attended, and had several community members and board members attend, as well as Hamilton County Supervisor, Brian Wells. I did send an invite to both our Village, and Town Supervisors, and Board of Trustees, but unfortunately, none of them attended. All participants who attended were very supportive, and appreciative of the information Sara sent. Indian Lake Director, Susan Rollings, and I, submitted a photo and short description of the meeting to the Hamilton County Express. It is my hope that this publicity, and sharing of updates and information, will continue to encourage the public, and our community, to take action against the IMLS cuts.



- Window washing interior and exterior

- Adding the last order of our memorial bricks to the front of the library
- Pulling out the dead bush by gazebo
- Having fresh lines painted on the front and back parking lots
- Laying down new grass seeding

I haven't yet heard about financial awards for either the ALCA grant, or the Adk Foundation grant. The State Aid for Library Construction grant is now open, and this would be a good grant to apply for with our digital sign project, if the Adk Foundation grant isn't approved. Applications for the state grant are due at the end of August.


