

Monthly Report November 2025

The Collection Committee emailed to review purchases for the month. For November 2025, 35 items were ordered, and all items ordered have been received, and processed. The Collection Committee has received the collection list for December, and it will be approved via email. For November, we re-decorated the display case with information about our Charlotte book collection, and how individuals can donate these books to the library. We will continue this in December

The next Friends of the Library meeting will not take place until Dec 11, at 1pm. Mid month I emailed the Friends to ask for help on a few December programs that I anticipate will be busy. I've had one volunteer sign up.

Director's Report

During the month of November:

- We had total of 343 patrons visit the library. (Not including the ~160 for the Holiday Stroll.)
 - 243 adult patrons
 - 81 children patrons
 - 9 teen patrons
 - 10 Computers were used
- 571 items were checked out
 - Adult books was checked out 192 times
 - Adult video was checked out 32 times
 - Children's fiction was checked out 169 times
 - Econtent was checked out 151 times
- We registered 5 new patrons.
- 192 items were received to fill holds between MVLS & SALS
- 196 items were transferred to fill holds between MVLS & SALS
- 150 holds were placed
- 571 checkouts were completed
- 230 people used the wifi, for an average of 25 people per day

Other Updates

I will be submitting an application in December for the ALA's Transforming Communities grant. This application is for new, automatic doors to be installed. The amount we're asking for is around \$10,000 - the cost to cover the door installation, as well as the service to get it wired. We should be receiving a check from ALCA soon for the grant we were awarded for our summer reading programing. I haven't yet heard back about the NYS Construction grant that we applied for earlier this fall, for the funds to purchase a new digital sign. At Kim Bolan's request (our new SALS Director), I submitted a list of our library building's construction needs from 2026-2030. This information will be reported to the Division of Library Development, and is critical for the State Aid for Library Construction Program.

We did have an outdoor tree that has gone in the gazebo in years past, but somehow, this item has gone missing. Wade Hartmann was kind enough to install small wedges in the fiction stacks, to keep them from wobbling.

Building projects that are ongoing include:

In November, we had our first Teen Advisory Board (TAB) meeting at the library, with 6 teens in attendance. We developed a mission statement, discussed what projects they'd like to undertake, and the officers they'd like to elect. Hopefully, regular, or semi-regular meetings of this group will begin in 2026. We did receive a generous donation of \$1,000 for TAB, specifically. I let the group know, and they're excited to get to work next year.

Staring in January, I will be beginning my Masters in Library Science at University at Albany. The MLS program is completely online, and I look forward to bringing the knowledge from my studies to our library.
